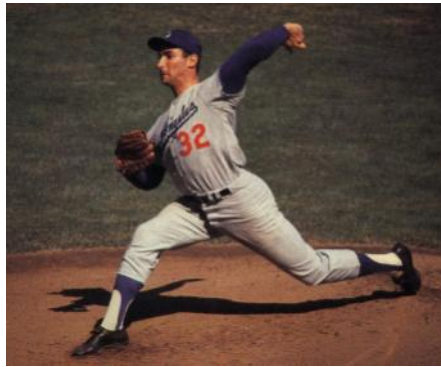

Many of you root for the Phillies even if you did not grow up in Philadelphia. Last week a storm suddenly hit the city and I watched the grounds crew spring to work. The wind was so sudden and strong that even the players raced from the dug out to wrestle the tarp down before the wind dangerously blew it out of control.

So much for unbridled individualism! We need each other. In music if one member of the orchestra is absent, the orchestra is dismembered.

In synagogues there is a quorum required before certain prayers are said. This quorum is called the Minyan and is rooted in the understanding that we humans are social animals. Our awareness is changed and heightened by the presence of other people. You may view the game better on TV but you become part of it with a crowd around you at the ball park. The movie you remember being so hysterically funny isn't nearly as funny when you watch it alone at home.

We pray, "God grant **us**," and confess "**we** believe," because we cannot free-lance our experience of God. The most reliable indicator of how well students do in high school is how often those students eat dinner with their parents. Being part of the orchestra makes all the difference. Every pastor knows that those students who are most likely to remain loyal to their confirmation vows are those students who continue to worship with their families.

The LA Dodgers lost the 1966 World Series because [Sandy Koufax](#) would not pitch the opening game which fell on Yom Kippur. We saw a Christian version of the same story when [Eric Liddell](#) would not run the 100 meters at the '24 Olympics because the finals fell on a Sunday. (It's true that he switched to the 400 and won that event a few days later, but virtue is not always so quickly rewarded!) The point is that Sandy Koufax and Eric Liddell saw themselves as members of God's orchestra who just happened to be athletes – not athletes who just happened to be members of God's orchestra.



It's been said the greatest enemy of the best is the second best. I pray this summer will be for you a season of re-creation. I pray you will catch God's breath and having caught God's breath, be inspired to turn your sorrows into symphonies and live as joyful members of God's orchestra all the days of your life. See you on Sundays.

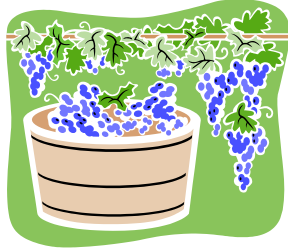

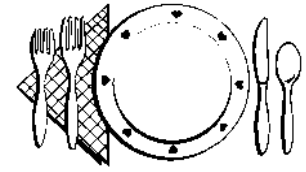


Thinking Ahead -

The Summer Months in St. Paul's History



- 1868** **The probable date for the groundbreaking of the original church building took place on July 21.**
- 1885** **The Rev. Edwin L. Miller was installed as the first full-time pastor of St. Paul's on July 19.**
- 1898** **The envelograph system was adopted by the Council on July 18 as a means of collecting offerings; appointed collectors were no longer responsible for receiving contributions for the support of the church.**
- 1908** **The church was re-consecrated on August 2 following a \$500 renovation that included installation of six memorial stained-glass windows.**
- 1911** **The Council decided on August 6 to order 300 anniversary programs from the *Doylestown Democrat* for \$8.75, less than the \$9.00 that would have been charged by *The Intelligencer*.**
- 1936** **The Council decided on July 6 to install an inside toilet "for the ladies".**
- 1978** **Syrian bread, made by members of the Altar Guild, was used for the first time during Holy Communion on July 2, replacing the traditional wafers.**
- 1978** **A sanctuary sound system was dedicated on August 27 to provide the capability of recording services, allow people in the lounge and nursery to hear the service, and assist worshippers with hearing difficulties.**
- 1982** **A garden table was set up in the narthex on summer Sundays containing fresh fruits and vegetables from members' gardens. Proceeds from the sales were designated for world hunger and relief agencies.**
- 1989** **The first church van was dedicated on August 27.**

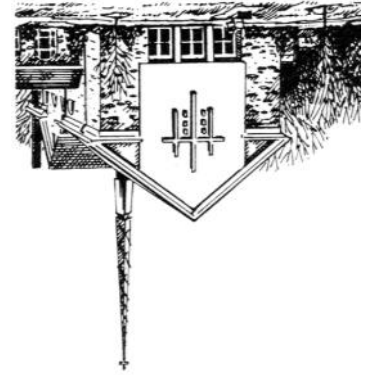
